

Methods

Design

• Cross-sectional descriptive study

Recruitment

- February March 2021
 NAPNAP membership listserv
 Internal message boards
 Social media posts

Inclusion criteria

- · Pediatric-focused APRN or
- APRN student
- Current or past NAPNAP member

Exclusion criteria

• < 18 years



Instrument

- Investigator-developed web-based REDCap survey
 - Information about study
 - Implied consent "click next"
- Survey items
 - Demographics
 - Employment impact
 - Personal impact
 - Clinical practice impact Educator impact
 - Research impact


Analysis

- Descriptive statistics
- Preliminary qualitative content analysis
- 886 participants
 - 796 (90%) completed entire survey
 - 90 partial responses included in analyses


Personal experience with COVID-19


- 10% Tested positive


- 15% Isolated from household

 19% Friend or family member die of COVID-19


Vaccination status


- 73% fully vaccinated12% single vaccine6% awaiting eligibility





